Julie is a great singer and a pianist but after her mother's death everything turned upside down and now, she is been in a last trail at her school music band. On entering the room Julie see's Carrie sitting in the front row. It was her turn to play but when the moment came, she was overwhelmed by the memories of her mother that blocked her from proving herself. So, she got up and said that she can't play but in spite that, she could hear Carrie saying "Is this is the part when we clap?" (16). Carrie takes advantage of each opportunity to criticize Julie.

Julie being unable to join the school music club, goes back home very depressed, felt hard to express the feeling to her father. For the betterment of Julie's mental health her father decides to move to different place so that Julie would not miss her mother. Though Julie's mother was a musician, she has set up a small studio in their garage. Julie's father requests her to clean the musical garage since it will help him to take good pictures and sell the house. However, every time Julie enters the studio, she is constantly disturbed by her mother's sentiments, but she faces them and goes in to clean the garage. While cleaning she found a box with lots of musical stuff, in it she finds a CD written sunset curve along with t-shirt. Julie got curious to know the music from the CD, so when she played it, suddenly there appeared three phantoms which literally shook her.

The phantoms identified themselves as members of the sunset curve band. When she googles it, she realizes that they are phantoms who died in 1995 after eating a hotdog. But now it's 2020. Caleb now approaches Alex, Luke, and Reggie, inviting them to join his band. But Luke said that they already had a band. Caleb stated that if they perform with him, they will be seen to everyone and will be greeted with cheers and clapping. He replied he'd give them some time to think about it. Conclusion:
